



Called to Make Disciples — Week 4

We are *kaleo*, or *called* by Christ to make disciples. We will answer this call by _____.

Objective: For each of us to fill in this blank..

Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you...

Matthew 28:19-20 (NIV)

- Who has God put around you that doesn't know Christ?
- What are some specific ways you can reach out to those people and disciple them?

Join with others in following my example, brothers, and take note of those who live according to the pattern we gave you.

Philippians 3:17 (NIV)

- Everyone needs a Paul (someone to disciple us) and everyone needs a Timothy (someone to disciple). Who is (or could be) your Paul? Who is (or could be) your Timothy?

Two people can accomplish more than twice as much as one; they get a better return for their labor. If one person falls, the other can reach out and help. But people who are alone when they fail are in real trouble.

Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 (NLT)

- One way we become more like Christ is by being part of a community of Christ followers. Describe a time when a community of Christ followers helped you grow in your faith.
- What are some of the challenges that sometimes make it difficult for people to experience this kind of community?
- How will you personally answer Christ's call to go make disciples? How will you answer this call as a group?

Final thought: Pray with your group and during your personal prayer time this week for God to give you a desire to make disciples of others. Pray for those God has put around you that do not know Christ and that He will give you opportunities to reach out to them.

Read Matthew 4:18-22. In this passage, Jesus calls His first disciples, Peter, Andrew, James and John. His calling unto them was to "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." (4:19)

Where did these particular events take place? (4:18)

Who did Jesus see as He walked by? (4:18)

What were Simon and Andrew doing when Jesus approached them? (4:18)

What did these brothers do for a living? (4:18)

What exactly did Jesus say to Simon and Andrew? (4:19)

What was Simon and Andrew's response to Jesus' words? (4:20)

How long did Simon and Andrew deliberate over Jesus' offer? (4:20)

In what activity were James and John involved? (4:21)

What did Jesus do when He saw the two brothers, James and John? (4:21)

How did James and John react to Jesus' challenge? (4:22)

What does it mean to be a "fisher of men"?

How risky was it for Peter, Andrew, James, and John to drop everything (jobs and families) to go with Jesus?

How do you think you might have responded had you been fishing with these men and heard Jesus direct this challenge to you?

What do you think Jesus saw in these men?

What does it mean for you to follow Jesus?
